

Figure 1 SYLLABUS COVERED









Figure 4 Teachers approach to Teaching





Figure 5 Internal Evaluation Process by Teachers





Figure 6 Discussion on Performance in Assignment





Figure 7 Interest in promoting internship, student exchange field visit opportunities for students.























Figure 17 Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities








