Survey Methodology:

In order to understand student's satisfaction level, responses were collected on Likert Scale from the students of MBA (2 years program) I and II year all specialization and MCA studying in the institution. 



Figure 4 Teacher's approach to Teaching





Figure 5 Internal Evaluation Process by Teachers







Figure 7 Interest in promoting internship, student exchange field visit opportunities for students.






















