Dr. Madhulika Gupta mam highlighted the role of POs in ensuring that the curriculum is designed to prepare students for professional practice and further education.

Key Points:

- POs encompass a range of skills, including technical knowledge, problem-solving abilities, communication skills, and ethical practices.
- They provide a framework for curriculum development and continuous improvement.
- The achievement of POs is assessed through various means, including examinations, projects, internships, and other experiential learning activities.

Examinations

Examinations are a crucial part of the assessment process, providing a means to evaluate the extent to which students have achieved the COs and POs. Dr. Madhulika Gupta mam discussed the importance of designing examinations that are fair, comprehensive, and aligned with the course objectives.

Session on Psychological First Aid

Date: 11th Sept 2025

Introduction

Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an evidence-informed approach designed to offer humane, supportive, and practical assistance to people in distress during emergencies, disasters, or traumatic events. The key goals are to reduce initial distress, foster adaptive functioning, and connect people to ongoing support. On 11 September 2025, Dr. Pallavi Kasande delivered a session on PFA to first-year MBA & MCA students, aiming to equip them with foundational skills in psychological first aid, sensitize them to mental health in crises, and enhance their readiness to respond in real-life or academic stress contexts.

Details of the Session

Date: 12th Sept 2025

1. Introduction

Positive thinking refers to the mindset or attitude of focusing on the bright side of life and expecting favorable outcomes, even in difficult situations. It's not naïve optimism, but a deliberate psychological stance that combines realistic appraisal with hopeful expectancy.

Dr. Daniel Penkar sir, in his role as Group Dean (Academic Excellence & Placements) at ASM, emphasises positive thinking not just as a personal trait but as a skill to be cultivated in students. He considers it fundamental for academic success, career readiness, confidence in interviews, and overall mental well-being. The ASM Institute fosters this through workshops, personality development, communication training, etc.

2. Psychological Foundations

a) Optimism and Positive Psychology

- Rooted in the field of positive psychology, positive thinking relates to optimism, hope, resilience, gratitude, and self-efficacy. Research shows that people with an optimistic disposition tend to cope better with stress and have better physical health outcomes.
- The broaden-and-build theory (Barbara Fredrickson) is relevant: positive emotions (hope, interest, joy) broaden one's momentary thought-action repertoire and over time build enduring psychological resources (resilience, social support, coping skills).

b) Cognitive Mechanisms

- Cognitive Reframing / Self-Talk: How one talks to oneself—replacing negative or unhelpful thought patterns with more realistic, positive ones.
- Positive Expectation & Imagery: Visualizing success or favorable outcomes helps align one's behavior and effort toward those outcomes.
- Goal-Setting: Positive thinking often works hand-in-hand with setting meaningful, achievable goals. This gives direction and purpose.

c) Psychological & Health Benefits

Some documented benefits:

- Better stress management, lower anxiety.
- Improved mental well-being: less depression, more life satisfaction.
- Improved physical health: stronger immune system, better cardiovascular health.
- Enhanced performance: studies show that training in positive thinking skills improves self-control, self-awareness and may help academic success.

3. Challenges and Limitations

Positive thinking is powerful, but not without caveats. Dr. Penkar sir might highlight some of these in his psychological perspective:

- Unrealistic Optimism / Over-expectation: If expectations exceed reality, it may lead to disappointment.
- Ignoring Negative Realities: Positive thinking should not mean denial of real problems. It must be balanced with realism.
- Cultural Differences: What counts as “positive thinking” can depend on cultural context. For example, different beliefs about optimism vs. pessimism, or about modesty vs. self-assertion, may affect how positive thoughts are expressed.
- Trait vs. State: Some people are dispositionally more optimistic (trait), others more situationally positive in certain times. The ability to shift mindset may vary.

4. Application: Education & Placements

Given Dr. Penkar sir responsibility for academic excellence and placements, the power of positive thinking can be harnessed in following ways:

- Workshops / Training on confidence building, communication skills, interview skills. These help students overcome negative self-beliefs.

- Incorporating positive self-talk, visualization, goal setting into curricula or co-curricular activities.
- Mentoring or counselling to help students reframe failures as learning opportunities.

5. Recommendations

From Dr. Penkar sir perspective, and from psychological science, here are recommendations for implementing positive thinking in educational settings:

1. Structured Training Programs: Regular modules/seminars for students to learn positive psychology techniques—affirmations, visualization, gratitude, cognitive reframing.
2. Integrate into daily classroom life: Teachers/professors reinforce positive feedback; share stories of resilience; encourage students to reflect on successes.
3. Support Systems: Provide counselling, mentoring so that students who struggle with negative thinking have avenues to work on changes.
4. Assessment & Feedback: Track changes in student confidence, anxiety, placement outcomes to see the impact.
5. Balanced Approach: Encourage positive thinking while acknowledging obstacles; teach coping strategies; ensure optimism doesn't lead to unrealistic expectations.

7. Conclusion

The power of positive thinking is not merely motivational rhetoric—it has deep roots in psychological science and has measurable benefits for mental health, performance, resilience, and well-being. For institutions like ASM under the leadership of Dr. Daniel Penkar sir, embedding practices that cultivate positivity in students can yield better placements, improved confidence, and stronger personal growth. When fostered with realism and support, positive thinking becomes a transformative tool—for individuals and educational institutions alike.
